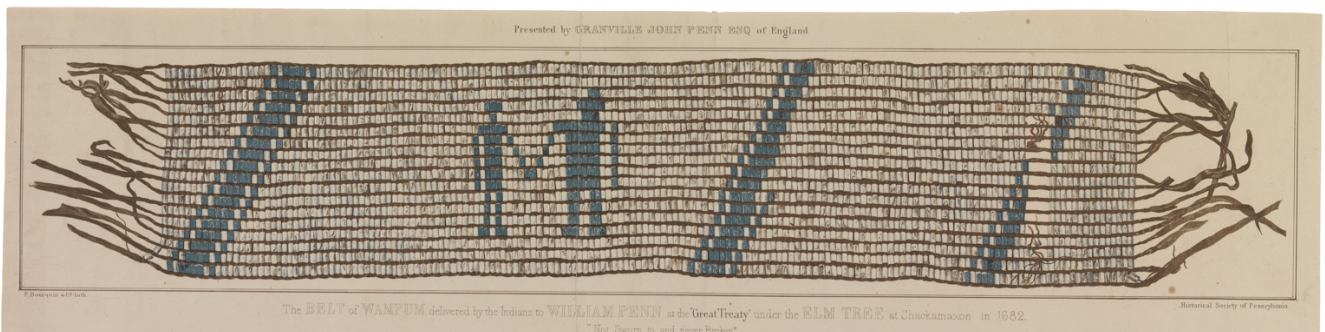

Penn's Treaty with the Indians (1771-72)

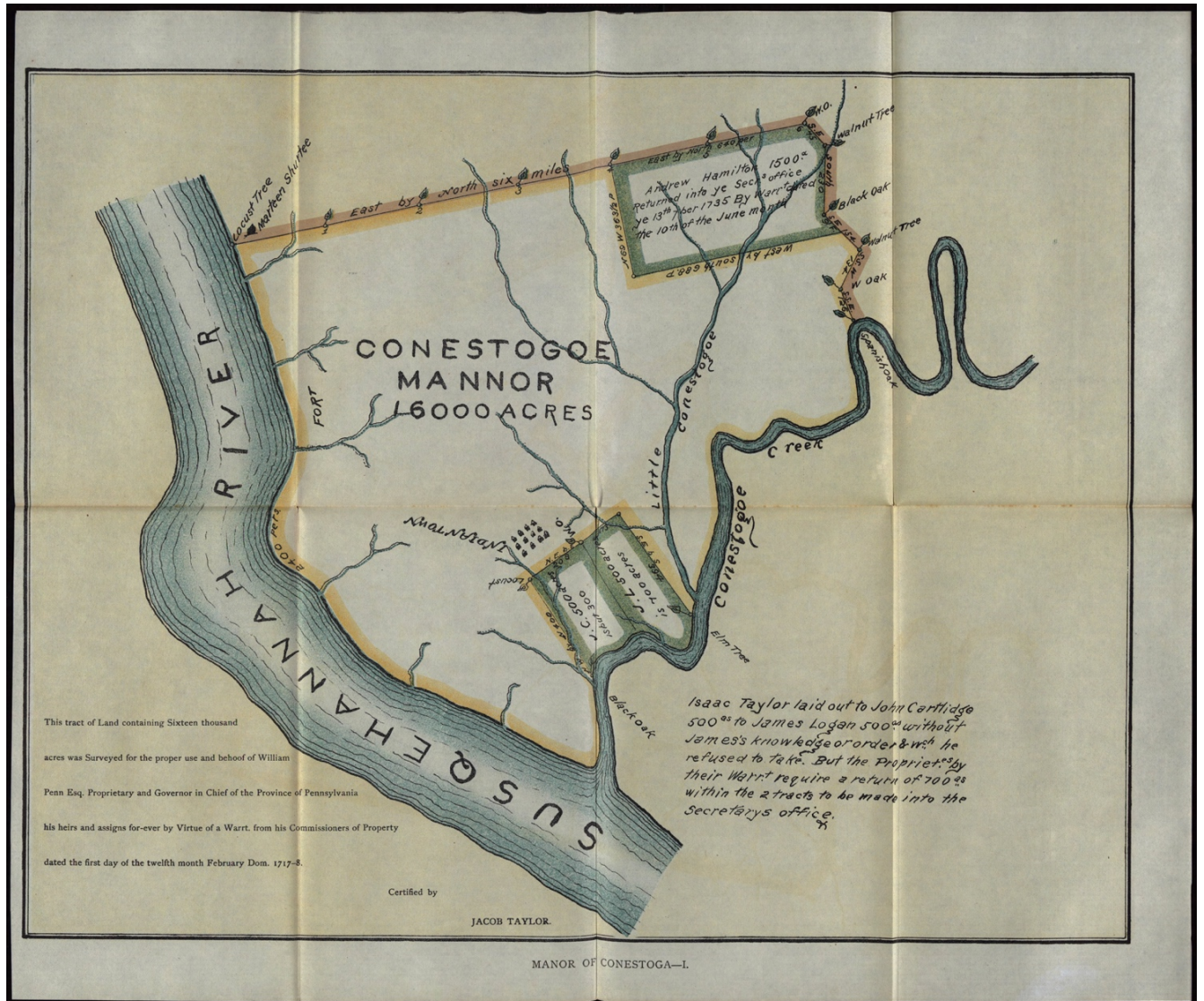


Penn Wampum Belt (1682 Shackamaxon treaty)

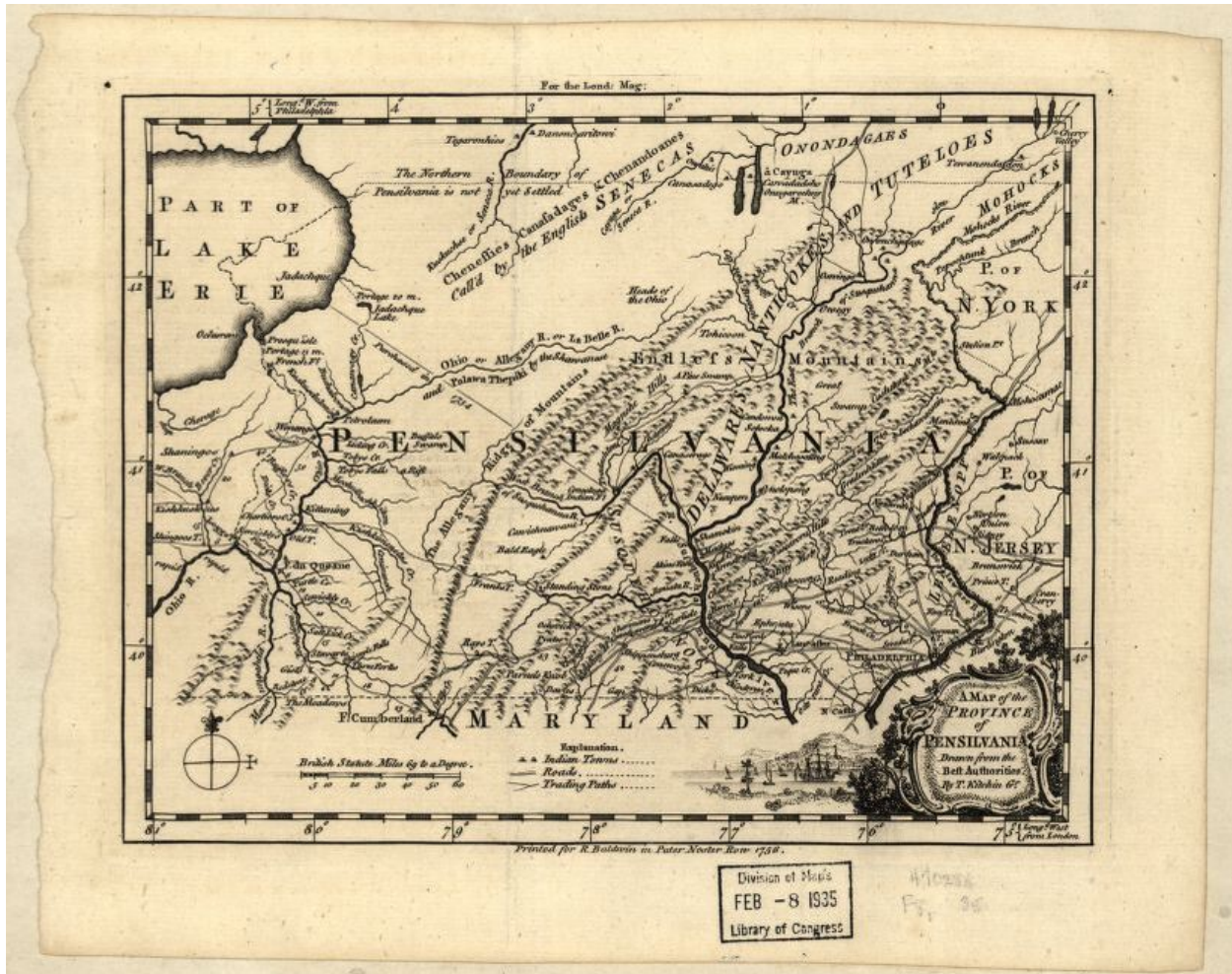
Conestoga Manor (1717)

To the Honorable Thomas Penn and Richard Penn (1770)



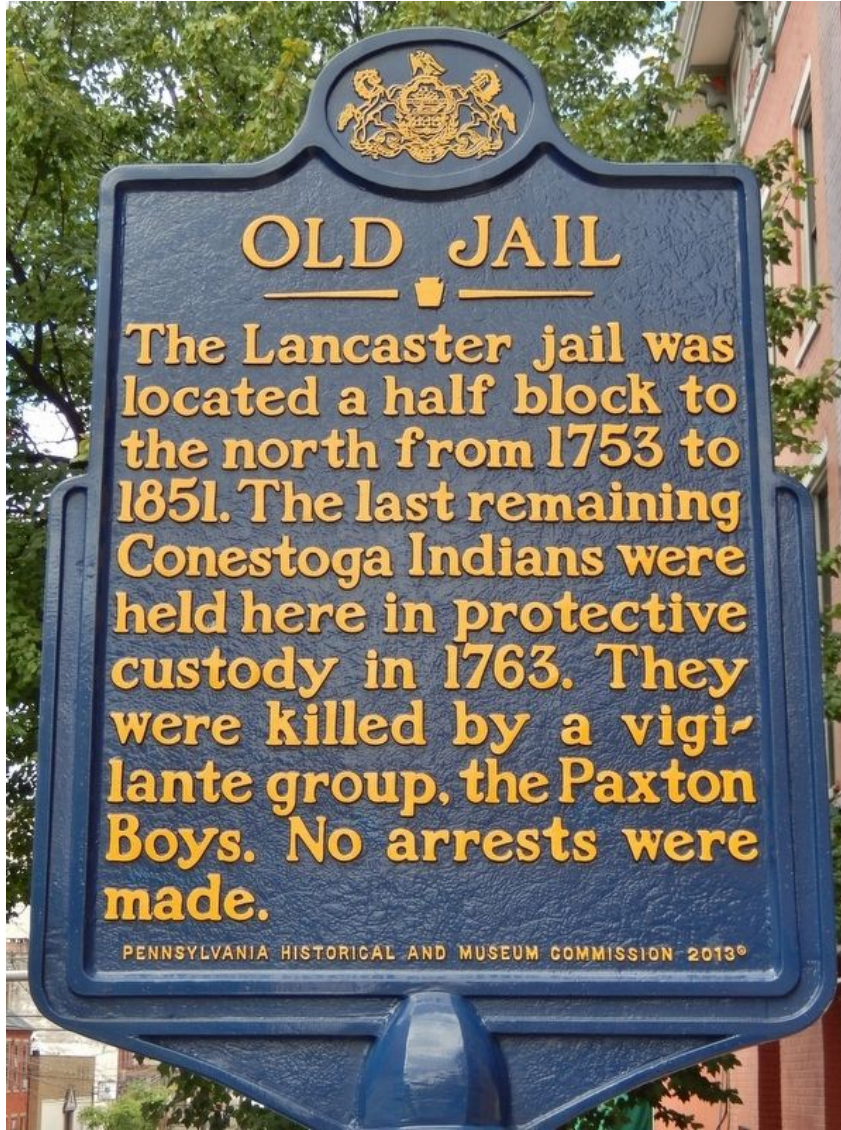
A Plan of the City and Environs of Philadelphia (1777)





Conestoga Indian Town

"About one mile eastwards stood the Conestoga Indian Town. Its peaceful Iroquoian inhabitants were visited by William Penn in 1701 who made treaties with them. In 1763 they were ruthlessly massacred by a frontier mob called the "Paxtang Boys." (1924)



Old Jail

"The Lancaster jail was located a half block to the north from 1753 to 1851. The last remaining Conestoga Indians were held here in protective custody in 1763. They were killed by a vigilante group, the Paxton Boys. No arrests were made." (2013)
